Below is a story from our partner, OneHope:

Faith might seem like an unlikely leader — a shy African girl from an impoverished Ugandan community where families like hers struggle for survival. But Faith has something special going for her: she has the children's club at her local church, where "Uncle Edwin" faithfully teaches the OneHope programs you send to tell the children about Jesus.

Faith has attended for four years — and last year, Edwin was trained in how to use the *Lead Today* program to help young people become godly leaders. Faith was old enough to be among the first class to receive the *Lead Today* materials — and it made a big impact!

She realized she would be able to share her faith in Christ with more boys and girls as a prefect at her school. It wasn't very likely someone from her economic background and circumstances would become an elected leader — But Faith presented herself and her aims as a prefect so well, she won the election!

Today, she is using the biblical principles she learned from *Lead Today* to help guide her schoolmates and effect positive change for the group.

It was a spectacular moment! He then came the following Wednesday and made the decision in front of all of his friends as well."

This November, we placed 600 tags on our Tree of Angels, located in the concourse. These gifts will go to specific children in our community, church, Mexico, and to our missionary partners serving locally and globally!

Our Handyman Team has been hard at work working on plumbing and repairing and installing different items around a single mom's home.

We also were able to provide 9 children in foster placement with much needed supplies. These children are from Oaks Church and the community. Four of those families were given a meal every day for 2 weeks because of their new placement. It's great to see the Church be the hands and feet of Jesus!

Community \ Transformation

November was a huge month for our community! Oaks Church and the Waxahachie Project partnered with John Houston and the Waxahachie Chamber of Commerce to host WX Leadership Summit featuring Dr. John C. Maxwell. Almost 1100 leaders from government, business, church, non-profit, health care, and education sectors came out to hear Dr. Maxwell speak on leadership. But that's not all, dozens raised their hands at the end of the day to accept Christ as Savior!
